



Lector A Reading (Lesson) from **Isaiah 61:1-3**

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion—to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory.

Very truly, I tell you, if you ask anything of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete.

The Leader and People pray responsively

For all who grieve the death of loved ones and so many losses, let us pray to our Lord Jesus Christ who said, "I am Resurrection and I am Life."

Lord, you consoled Martha and Mary in their distress; draw near to all of us who mourn for so much loss (name your loss at this time), and dry the tears of those who weep. *Hear us, Lord.*

You wept at the grave of Lazarus, your friend; comfort us in our sorrow.

Hear us, Lord.

You raised the dead to life; give to our loved ones and those whom have died eternal life.

Hear us, Lord.

You promised paradise to the thief who repented; bring all to know the joys of heaven.

Hear us, Lord.

Our brothers and sisters were washed in Baptism and anointed with the Holy Spirit; give *them* fellowship with all your saints.

Hear us, Lord.

They were nourished with your Body and Blood; grant *them* a place at the table in your heavenly kingdom. *Hear us, Lord.*

Comfort us in all of our sorrows and at the death of our loved ones and the losses of so much this past year; let our faith be our consolation, and eternal life our hope.

Silence may be kept.

The Celebrant concludes with one of the following or some other prayer Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to you our sorrows and our joys, our loved ones, who were reborn by water and the Spirit in Holy Baptism. Grant that *their* deaths may recall to us your victory over death, and be an occasion for us to renew our trust and the death of past dreams in your Father's love. Give us, we pray, the faith to follow where you have led the way; and where you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, to the ages of ages. *Amen*.

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. The peace of the Lord be always with you.


